


# **Brief History of OCHA**

- In 1991 the GA adopted Resolution 46/182 to strengthen the UN response to complex emergencies and natural disasters under a Department of Humanitarian Affairs (DHA) within the UN Secretariat
- In 1998, DHA was reorganized into OCHA. In 2006 OCHA employed 1,140 staff members in New York, Geneva and in the field with a budget of \$128,445,299
  - OCHA's Core Functions are:
    - Policy development
    - Advocacy of humanitarian issues
    - Coordination of humanitarian emergency response
    - OCHA's Role in Preparedness new Policy Instruction


EWEA – quarterly Flood preparedness matrix Seasonal Flood/Storm Risk Risk Mapping





# Summary OCHA Emergency Response & Preparedness

- Limited country presence
- -Works through support for UNRCs/HCs/IASC/HCT, UN agencies & partners
- -Capacity to deal with more than one disaster at a time in the region (24/7)
- Facilitates coordination
