Component 4. Regional Networking and Information Dissemination

4.1. Introduction

A large part of the success of PROMISE will be measured by the ability to replicate the outcomes of the demonstration projects in other vulnerable cities and areas within the target countries and the region.

The Information and Networking (I&N) strategy in the work plan period focuses on capturing successful examples, practices and processes emerging from implementation of city demonstration projects and identifying ways for packaging these in a variety of media for wider dissemination to different groups interested in urban disaster preparedness and mitigation practices. The focus is also on strengthening and institutionalizing networks and partnerships built during the implementation of program activities at regional and national levels.

I&N component of PROMISE aims to build public and private networks as a forum for exchanging information and experience on urban disaster management, with the goal of replicating successful urban disaster mitigation and preparedness practices from the demonstration projects throughout the region.

Since five of the city demonstration projects viz. Bangladesh, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka and Vietnam have commenced the activities under Program Phase I only in January 2006 and after, the role of I&N component during the nine months period of program implementation, in capturing and disseminating disaster mitigation knowledge to various groups (municipalities, city governments, administrators, bureaucrats, etc) interested in promoting mitigation and preparedness at community, city and national levels becomes very new and challenging. In the light of this, the work-plan focused on developing methodologies and tools that will help the program in capturing, building and disseminating the knowledge on urban disaster mitigation and preparedness to various target groups. The I&N Strategy therefore focused on strengthening the networks and partnerships built during the implementation of city demonstration projects by partners and regional program activities by ADPC to better facilitate the knowledge on urban disaster mitigation and preparedness throughout the region.

The I&N strategy adopted by PROMISE has a two-tiered approach:

- Regional I&N Strategy, and
- Country I&N Strategy

At the regional level, the strategy is to develop, maintain and support systems that would remain in place even after the activities supported by the PROMISE in the region

......

discontinues. In other words, this means institutionalization of specific networking events (such as WGM, meetings, discussions, etc) and information products (such as working papers, case studies) and tools (electronic newsletter web-site, listserv, etc) for sharing and exchanging knowledge on urban disaster mitigation and preparedness. This, in the long term, would help ADPC to further enrich its existing knowledge base on urban disaster mitigation and preparedness, which would prove to be of immense help to cities, municipalities and urban communities of the region by getting access to the knowledge base.

At the national level, the strategy is to identify and capture specific components and elements (documents, reports, lessons learned, successful urban disaster mitigation and preparedness practices, public awareness campaigns, etc) from each of the city demonstrations that would enrich the regional knowledge base and strengthen the "network" on urban disaster mitigation and preparedness facilitated by ADPC. Also, the networks built at national levels during the course of implementation of city demonstration projects needs to be strengthened and oriented to become integral part of the regional network based at ADPC. In doing this, whatever necessary tools, needs assessment, capacity building, etc are required to be put in place, are to be identified and strengthened at national levels. The USAID has a partner network and PROMISE will continue to build partnerships with such partners to expand the network and some of the information products may include the experience of such partners involved in national level urban disaster mitigation and preparedness practices.

4.2. Program documents developed at regional level

- PROMISE Brochure: The PROMISE Brochure has been developed to promote the program. It contains a basic description of the goals, objectives and components.
- 2) Presentation Slides: PROMISE presentation slides are revised every quarter to incorporate the latest updates on the program. The PROMISE staff and other ADPC staff members use this set of slides during various conferences and briefings to provide information about the program, and generate interest in its outcomes.
- 3) **PROMISE branding strategy:** The branding strategy was developed in line with the ADPC and USAID branding strategies to achieve consistency in material production and publication to provide more visibility for program implementing partner and donor agency. This has been circulated widely for usage in publications display at various occasions.
- 4) Calendar of Events: Ongoing calendar of events including activities at regional and national levels will continue to appear in the PROMISE webpage under "What's new". This is being made available in advance on the web site and is being updated regularly to reflect the latest updates on various activities under the program. PROMISE regional courses are also posted in the ADPC home page.

"Disaster Mitigation in Asia" is the monthly electronic newsletter maintained by PROMISE. Now on its 60th issue, the newsletter is sent to more than 2,000 subscribers. This product serves to promote the accomplishments of the PROMISE to stakeholders within and outside the region and to inform the project partners of each other's activities. This is produced monthly and is distributed by email. It contains:

4.4. Status Report on Networking Events

The program uses the opportunity to replicate success through existing ADPC institutional linkages in the region for networking and sharing of experiences. For this second phase of the program when the program partners are beginning to implement projects in their respective cities, the strategy was The strategy is to identify and capture specific components and elements (documents, reports, lessons learned, successful urban disaster mitigation & preparedness practices, public awareness campaigns, etc.) from each of the city demonstrations that would enrich the regional knowledge base on urban disaster mitigation & preparedness facilitated by ADPC. Specifically, this involved:

- 1. Developing and packaging the available information and program achievements in a variety of media for wider dissemination to different groups interested in urban disaster preparedness and mitigation practices.
- 2. Encouraging country partners to promote their accomplishments through existing networks of local authorities and with international organizations interested in disaster mitigation.
- 3. Organizing the 2007 Coordinators meeting as a venue for partners to take stock of mid-project accomplishments, and share implementation problems and solutions.
- 4. Organizing the 2008 Annual Working Group Meeting as a venue for partners to share their experiences with other stakeholders.

4.4.1. Developing New Networks and Strengthening Existing Networks

The program activities under Phase I has had involvement of many national and regional-level partners. The Regional Program staff and national partners have attended many fora at International, regional and national levels. Under Phase II, program partners attempt to expand the existing network to other organizations that will expand the outreach of the program. For this purpose, the networking partners of the program can be classified into three groups:

- Organizations that conduct research and/or maintain datasets on hazards, vulnerability indicators, and/or monitor risk reduction activities by the public and private sector; and
- Organizations that conduct training and information dissemination activities.
- Organizations involved in humanitarian activities or post-disaster activities in urban areas supported by USAID and USAID partners

Specialist knowledge is found in research institutions whose activities generate data, improvements on current disaster mitigation practices, innovative approaches and relevant knowledge. However, demonstration projects can also generate data on risk reduction, new ideas, innovative practices and different perspectives, and the network could give research institutions access to these real-world learning laboratories. Program partners have agreed upon Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) for such institutions to provide a technical support base for the benefit of both the partner and the city

government at their demonstration project sites. Institutions that specialize in providing training on public administration at the local government or local authority level are seen as vital for the dissemination of new ideas on governance and disaster risk reduction.
