Course Overview

The Disaster Management course was first delivered in 1986 and is ADPC's flagship course. The two-week training course offers skills and knowledge on multi-hazard, multi-level, multi-agency, and multi-disciplinary facets, and address both event-related activities as well as those that need to be undertaken on a daily basis to mitigate the potential impacts of natural hazards.



Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Describe the basic concepts, terminology and models of disaster risk management
- Identify and assess disaster risks using a risk management approach
- Plan and develop effective strategies and systems for disaster risk reduction
- Develop effective processes for preparedness planning in order to improve disaster response and recovery programs
- Effectively and efficiently set up and utilize an emergency coordination center to manage disaster events
- Explain disaster recovery frameworks and policies appropriate to the country
- Identify and describe key implementation issues and requirements in disaster management

Method

The teaching approach shall use various pedagogy and andragogy methods during the training: i) Class Room

Learning, ii) Case – Studies, iii) Presentations, iv) Classroom Participations, and v) Group Exercises. The course shall be conducted in English.

- Disaster Risk practitioners involved in designing and implementing DM/DRM related projects and programs
- Mid-level Disaster Risk professionals, development and humanitarian response practitioners involved in DM/DRM initiatives
- Government officials, consultants, researchers, specialists of training and academic institutions, I/NGOs and donors representatives who are interested in acquiring fundamental knowledge on DM/DRM

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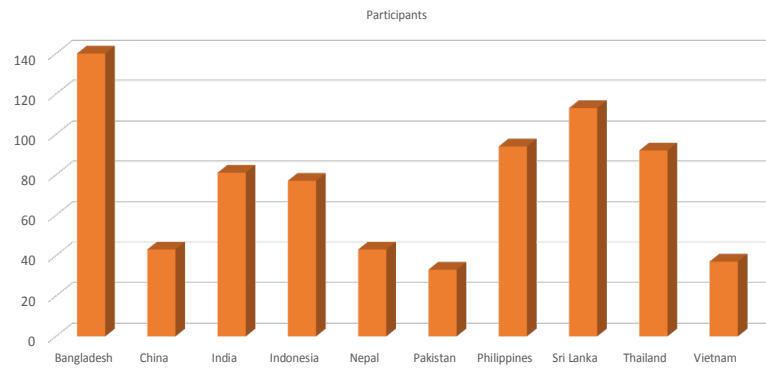

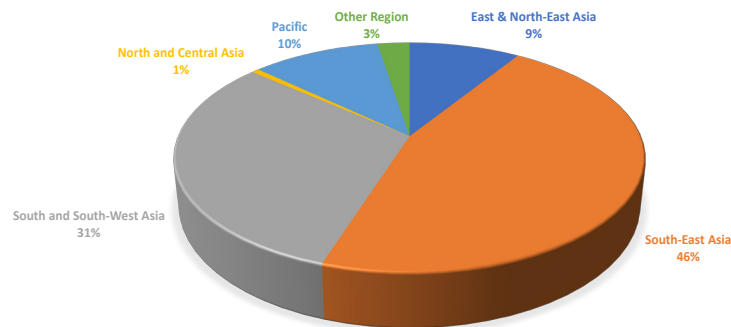
