Lessons learned on effective flood risk management shared at International Flood Forum

BANGKOK, Thailand – The International Flood Forum will take place on 25 July at Swissotel Nai Lert Park in Bangkok, Thailand. The forum is expected to be attended by Royal Thai Government agencies and Academic Institutes in Thailand, as well as flood risk management experts from Australia, Japan, Lao PDR, Nepal, Philippines, Singapore, USA and Vietnam; private sector, United Nations, Asian Development Bank and Japan International Cooperation Agency.

The forum offers national and international experts an opportunity to exchange experiences and to identify practical strategies for flood risk management and disaster risk reduction. The aim is to strengthen knowledge and awareness on important issues that should be considered in flood risk management through lessons learned and sound practices from different countries. The forum also provides participants with networking opportunities in order to facilitate further collaboration.

The forum will serve as a platform for sharing experiences on sound flood management from experts in and outside the region. It will be useful to see how different countries have integrated risk reduction measures into recovery plans.
