

ADPC Academy Regional Course Offerings for 2022

As Thailand opens its doors to visitors, experience the worthwhile, unforgettable, serious but fun learning only ADPC can offer.

The ADPC Academy offers a number of regional training courses each year. The courses are designed to address the current priority regional capacity building needs for the Asia Pacific region through a combination of online and face-to-face activities.

Online activities will generally take place over a number of days, with a total duration each day of 180 minutes to 270 minutes (3 to 4.5 hours). All the face-to-face activities will take place in Bangkok, Thailand.

27 th Community-based Disaster Risk Reduction Course (CBDRR-27)	May 9-13, 2022 (Online) May 16-20 (Face-to-Face)	\$ 1,900.00
Course purpose: The course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to develop and empower communities to better prepare for preventing, responding and recovering from disasters.		

¹All course fees are inclusive of cost of instructions, access to the course materials and course certificate after completion. For face-to-face and blended courses, fees include, morning and afternoon snacks and lunch during the session days and accommodation. It is highly recommended for the participants to avail of the accommodation package to facilitate convenience given the health protocols and requirements.

Special rates will be given to: i) returning alumni; ii) returning organizations; iii) female participants; iv) public and private Thai organizations; and v) organizations sending at least three participants.

<p>Key aspects: The course is based on the premise that all disasters are local. This means that it is always the communities that bear the brunt of the impacts of disasters. Better disaster prevention, response and recovery measures will help to protect communities from disaster impacts, and will also protect institutional / organizational investments in communities.</p>		
<p>16th Flood Disaster Risk Management Course (FDRM-16)</p> <p>Course purpose: The course will provide participants with the insightful knowledge and skills necessary to avoid or at least mitigate the impacts of floods.</p> <p>Key aspects: The course is highly relevant given that floods alone account for 40% of the natural hazards in the Region. <p>1st Nature-based Solutions Course (NBS-1)</p> <p>Course purpose: The course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to develop and implement nature-based solutions (NbS) in disaster risk reduction (DRR) and climate change adaptation (CCA) contexts.</p> <p>Key aspects: With the effects of climate change becoming more evident, NbS can greatly enhance resilience to disasters and climate change. Not only can they reduce exposure to hazards or act as natural buffers against them, they can also remove greenhouse gases from the atmosphere and promote the integrity of ecosystems, which are both likely to be critical in the achievement of DRR and CCA goals.</p> <p>Given that the recent COP 26 agreement will set the global agenda on climate change for the next decade, DRR and CCA professionals are strongly encouraged to attend this course.</p>	<p>August 22-26, 2022 (Face to Face)</p>	<p>\$1,600.00</p>

<p>50th Disaster Management Course (DMC-50)</p> <p>Course purpose: The course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to develop and implement appropriate disaster risk management strategies.</p> <p>Key aspects: This is one of the ADPC Academy's flagship courses, along with the CBDRR and FDRM courses. Initially offered shortly after the founding of ADPC in 1986, it has been redesigned and updated a number of times to ensure that it continues to be relevant for DRM professionals in a rapidly changing world.</p> <p>The course has so far produced more than 1,000 alumni who have gone on to make major contributions in the DRM field. We want you to be part of this unforgettable learning so please register for the Test and Go that is tentatively set on 1st February 2022.

Travelers from ALL countries/areas (not just the 63 previously designated) will be eligible to apply for this scheme. At the same time, instead of one test upon arrival, two RT-PCR tests will be required. One on the first day of arrival and the second on Day 5 of arrival.

This means the following should be prepared:

- Proof of hotel booking for Day 1 and Day 5 (The hotels can be different hotels but must provide an accommodation service in partnership with certified hospitals for the RT-PCR test according to SHA ++/AQQ/ AHQ).
- A Confirmed Payment for SHA++ Hotel and pre-payment of 2 RT-PCR tests
- A Certificate of Vaccination / Vaccine passport
